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Information you can share

Tryon Creek State Park is one of the largest parks in the Portland area. The 670 acre natural day use area has eight miles of hiking trails, 3.5 miles of horse trails, and a 3 mile paved bicycle trail

The seven mile Tryon Creek flows through the park and its tributaries widen and deepen the canyon as they flow to the Willamette River.

A watershed is a large basin of land that when rain falls into the basin, all the runoff will run downhill and drain into the river, stream or lake at the bottom and eventually enters the larger river through surface or ground water flow.
